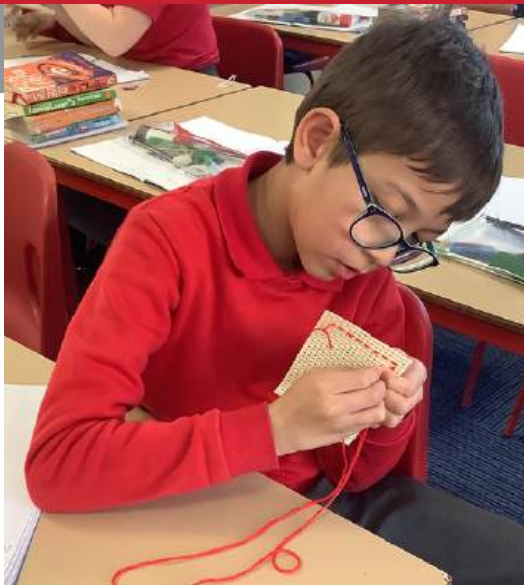

Today, it has been wonderful to see the children in their unusual clothing for Comic Relief. We know that every donation will make a difference in others' lives.

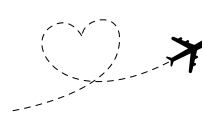

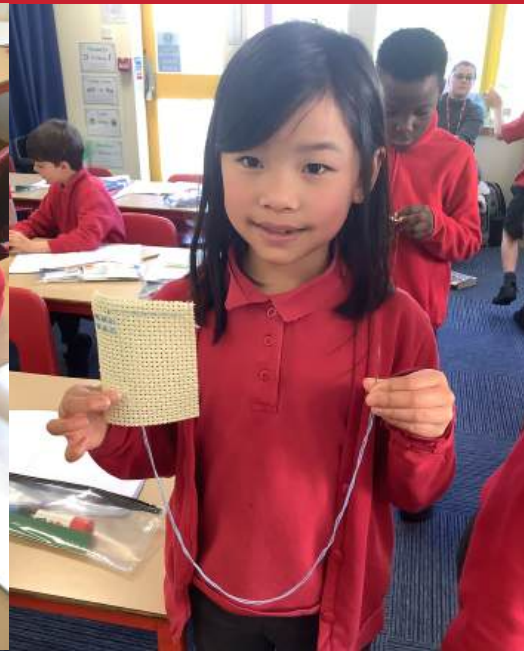
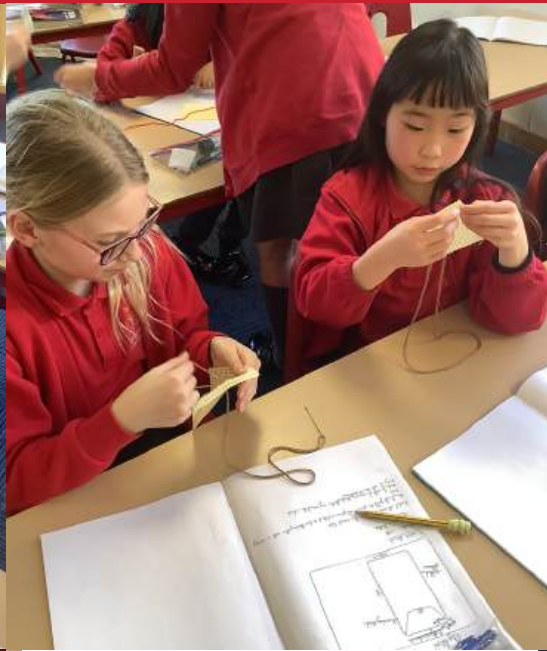


Year 1/2

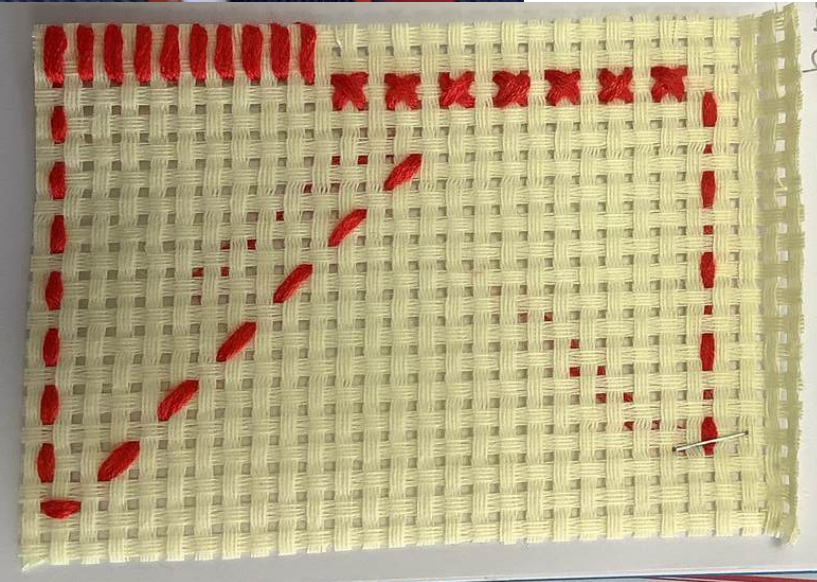
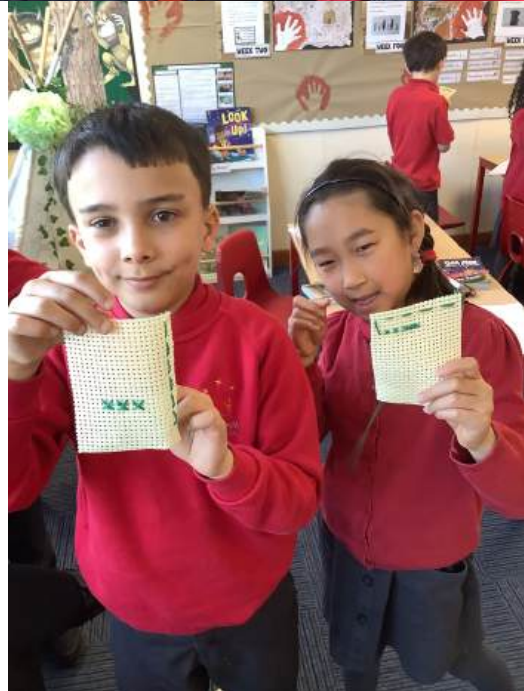
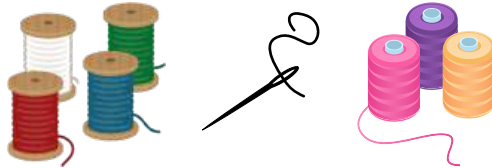


THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS
